
Installation, configuration and usage

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
1. Installation

To install the plugin go to **Plugins -> Add New -> Upload Plugin -> Choose zip file and click Install Now**. Once install click **Activate Plugin**



2. Checklist & activation

HTTPS and **GMP** extension is required, if all is ok click **Activate Plugin** to get started




3. Send notification

Once plugin is activated you will see a success message and notification confirmation box to allow notification from this site. Click **Allow**.


3.1 Custom notification

To send custom notification click fill the form and click send button



3.2 Test Before Send

When you have clicked Allow notification you will notice that an orange **Test Before Send** button appears. You can use this button to test notifications (to check how it will appear to users) before send. This page is self explanatory, just fill the information to send messages.



4. Notification Settings

In the Notification Settings tab, you will see various sections depending on plugins you have installed. These sections are


1. Welcome Notification
2. New Post
3. Woocommerce (if installed)
4. BuddyPress (if installed)



4.1 Welcome notification setup

A welcome notification is sent when a new user subscribe (allow) for notification. This is the great way to welcome your users and redirect them to appropriate page like privacy policy, terms and condition or any other offers.

To setup welcome notification go **Notification Settings** —> **Welcome Notification**



4.2 New Post

New post section is used when ever a new post is published. You can use custom post types as well. In this section you can set global settings when new post is published


4.3 Woocommerce

Under Woocommerce section in Notification Settings tab, you will see 3 sections.

1. **New Product**
This notification triggers when a new product added to store
2. **Price Drop**
This notification triggers when regular price is dropped
3. **Sale Price**
This notification triggers when sale price added
4. **Back in stock**
This notification triggers when item back in stock from 0.
5. **Abandoned Cart**
This notification triggers after specific interval set by admin to send notification to user if there is any abandoned carts
6. **Low stock**
This notification is for admin and triggers when product stock gets low
7. **New order**
This notification is for admin and triggers when customer place an order

4.4 BuddyPress

In this section you can turn on or off notification of any specific event
